Automotive Collision Repair Pathways

The Automotive Collision Repair program emphasizes either major automotive collision repair or automotive collision repair or automotive painting and refinishing depending on the specialization area a student chooses to complete. Program graduates may work as major collision repair technicians or painting and refinishing technicians. The number of jobs in this field is anticipated to increase by 10% nationally and 20% in the State of Georgia over the next 10 years.
